Initiator and responsible for the 'Salzburg Project' - internationally widely discussed as an architecture and
urban regeneration model

Joint founder of the Austrian Green Party

1988 - 1992: Federal Party Manager of the Austrian Green Party

1990 - 1992: Parliamentary group chairman of the Greens in the National Parliament

until 1996: Member of the Austrian National Parliament

since 1991: European Speaker of the Austrian Greens

1995 - 1999: Member of the European Parliament
Member of the BSE Inquiry Committee (1996)
Member of the Institutional Committee

1999 - 2002: Elections for the European Parliament: 9.3% of votes casted
Head of the Austrian Green Delegation in the EP
1. Vice-President in Committee on Constitutional Affairs

Member of the Convention for the formulation of the Charter of Fundamental Rights
